Flood damage at Peiseler Remscheid

As reported in the media, heavy rain and storms hit Remscheid and the Bergisches Land region on Wednesday 14 July 2021. The Morsbach, which borders the company's property, turned into a raging river and overflowed its banks extensively throughout the valley.



Peiseler's lower-lying production areas were not spared either; in some places the water was up to 1m high in the production halls - fortunately, all colleagues & employees are doing well under the circumstances.

After the water was able to drain away overnight, the first clean-up work began on Thursday morning - the fire brigade was able to pump out deeper areas and cellars. The exact damage cannot yet be estimated. What is clear is that some production machines in the milling, grinding and measuring areas have fallen victim to the masses of water.

Assembled and finished sub-units were largely spared, purchased and in-house production parts as well as stocks still have to be checked in detail.

As of today, we assume that production will be interrupted for several days, which will also affect planned deliveries in the coming weeks. Our production control is working at full speed to get an overview of the damage and downtime. Until then, we cannot make any reliable statements about upcoming delivery dates.



We ask for your understanding that we have to invoke force majeure in the case of this extraordinary natural event and will do everything we can to resume regular business operations as quickly as possible.

Our colleagues in sales are in close coordination with production and will inform you about the actual status in the next few days.
